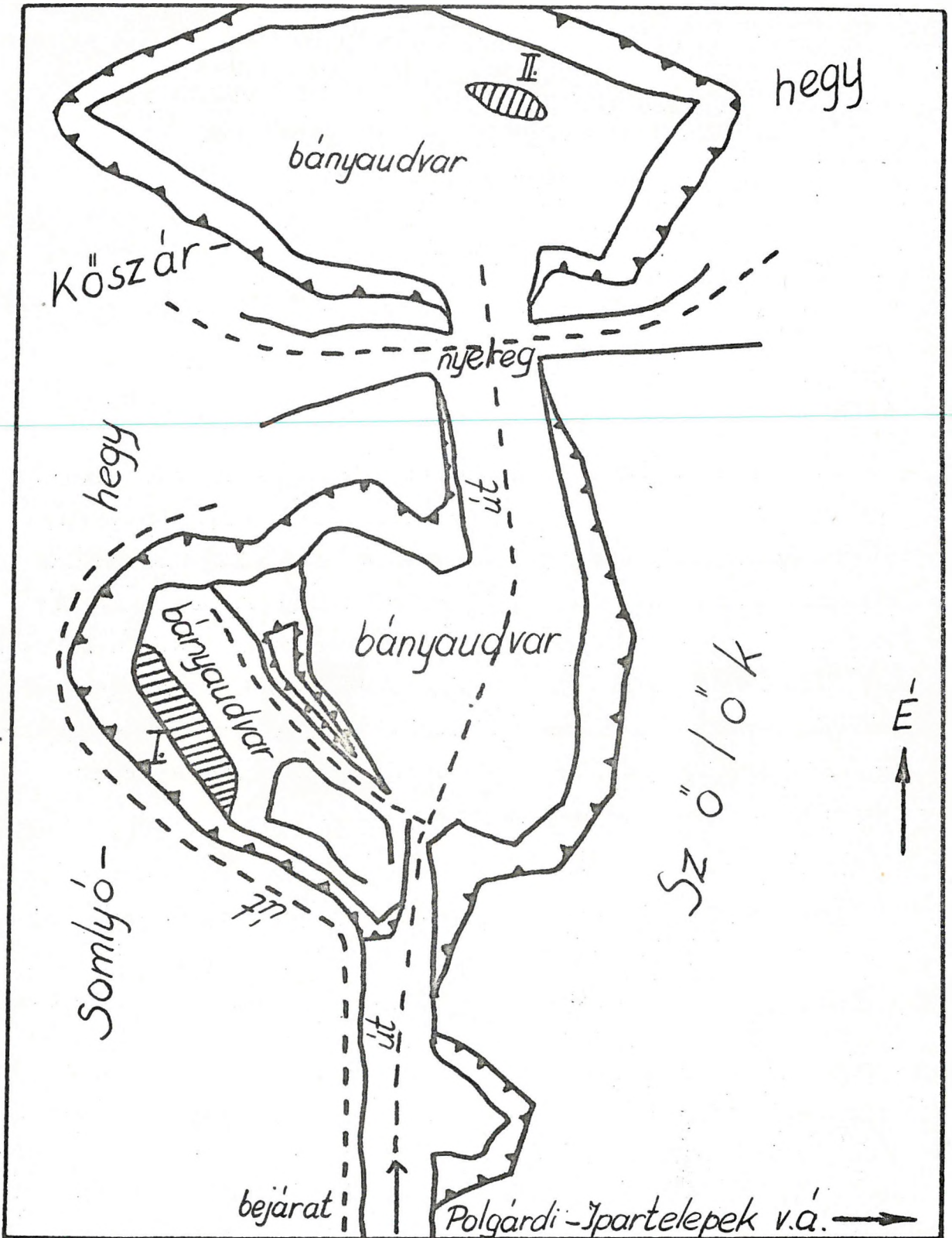


A NEW OCCURENCE OF PIKERMI-TYPE VERTEBRATA
IN THE BIG QUARRY OF POLGÁRDI-IPARTELEPEK,
TRANSDANUBIA, HUNGARY

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Abstract

The author announce the discovery of a new occurrence of Pikermi-type benebed from the Kőszárhegy quarry near Polgárdi village. This quarry is a prolongation of the nearby Somlyóhegy quarry described by T. KORMOS in 1911, where an abundant Pikermi-type vertebrate fauna of Pleistocene age was found half a century ago. Intesive quarrying put an end to the new occurrence as well. Nevertheless, the carefully collected material provides the possibility of describing vertebrate species new for Hungary. Moreover, the new find supports the previous assumption that a rich vertebrate fauna, consisting mainly of mammals, was living in this area during the Pleistocene.
